Hugo:

The House stimulus bill has a \$3 billion increase for the NSF, \$100 million is directed to EHR, \$60 million to the Noyce program and \$40 million to math-science partnerships.

The Senate bill, announced Friday, proposes \$1.40 billion for the NSF. I do not have a breakdown of this allocation.
